

Theme : Combatting climate change through social, cultural, political and economic means

The General Assembly,

1. Requires the establishment of
 - a- a quota of green energy used in their industry to reduce their CO2 emissions
 - b- the creation of an international fund - funded by the UN - to help countries that cannot reach this goal

2. Calls upon the Ad Hoc Working Group to assess and assure the sufficiency of each country's contribution to reducing the effects of climate change, this would be balanced with an assessment of each country's loss due to climate change. Recommends that the countries that will not reach the determined contribution announced and reviewed every year should as a consequence :
 - a- in case of developed countries, see increase its stake for Green Climate Fund that will be determined by specialised institutions, introduced especially to allow the system to rely on specific and determined criterias that will be delimited, assessed and announced to all under the form of a resolution, presented at the next COP. The fine will be diverted to developing countries throughout the Green Climate Fund, as well as the Least Developed Countries Fund and the Special Climate Change Fund (administered by the Global Environment Facility)
 - b- In case of a developing country, a punishment has to be assessed, it could be considered that they pay back one year of the financial aid of the green climate fund, interpreting their failure as a wrong use of the money that is aimed to serve their environmental transition;
 - c- in the case of countries being unable to fulfill these contributions due to a declared and recognized state of war or emergency, the fine would be exceptionally and temporarily suspended to enable the said countries to rebuild economically

3. Calls upon the standing committee of Finance and other institutions concerned by the redistribution of the green climate fund to assess and determine how much measure should apply according to each country's state of economy and global situation.

4. Affirms that such measures can only be positive for all, considering that the contributions would be ser and decided by the countries themselves, further reviewed as said on paragraph 17, and thus, considered achievable in 5 years by the countries themselves

5. Reminds that further details have to be explored.

6. Urges all developed member states to help economically developing countries in order to guide them as they begin their ecological transition by:
 - a- Creating an international fund managed by the UN that will be equally split between countries depending on their needs as LEDC's.
 - b- Sending experts to promote renewable technologies so they can become self sufficient.
7. Requests MEDCs and the UN to provide the means necessary to conduct campaigns raising awareness of environmental crimes and better habits for LEDC populations and ways in which they can implement sustainable development.
